

CURRENT STUDY MILESTONES

- · 900 patients enrolled by 1 January, 2013
- All follow-up forms were sent to participating sites on 29 June, 2012 and should be received at the Coordinating Centre by 15th November, 2012


ENROLMENT STATUS

As of 1 November, 2012, 669 patients have been enrolled in the TB:HIV Study. Enrolment status per region and required enrolment numbers are shown in Figure 1. In order to meet recruitment deadlines for enrolling patients we strongly encourage all investigators to make every effort to continuously identify eligible patients and to consecutively enroll them as soon as possible. All HIV-infected patients older than 16 years diagnosed with active TB are eligible and enrolment forms should be submitted to CHIP as soon as possible.



FOLLOW-UP STATUS

Figure 2 presents an overview of the follow-up status per region. If you haven't returned the forms yet, we kindly remind you that the extended deadline is 15 **November, 2012**. It is critical that we receive these prior to the next round of follow-up in December 2012. We also encourage all investigators to collect *as complete follow-up information as possible*.

MYCOBACTERIAL SAMPLES

We have received Mycobacterial (Mtb) samples from several sites (thank you very much for that!), and more are on their way. Collection of Mtb samples provides a unique feature of our collaboration and will enable centralized laboratory analyses of genetic profiles and resistance. We encourage all investigators to arrange storage of all Mtb samples cultured from the participating patients so that they can be shipped to the Coordinating Centre at a later stage. Each sample is reimbursed by 30 Euro and shipment costs will be covered by CHIP.

This summer you were all invited to participate in the sub-study on collection of plasma samples in HIV-infected patients during TB disease with the purpose of studying biomarkers of TB/HIV coinfection. If you have plasma samples stored on patients already enrolled in the TB:HIV study, it is also possible to contribute these to the study.
